1. Introduction

GHADAQ for Development and FAOYEMEN signed a Letter of Agreement (LoA) called: "Provision of Services for Distribution of Emergency Agricultural Inputs to IDPs and Host Communities in Hodeidah Governorate". The services are under the framework of the project "YEMEN SMALLHOLDER AGRICULTURAL PRODUCTIVITY RESTORATION AND ENHANCEMENT PROJECT" financed by the World bank and implemented by FAOYEMEN.

The project development objective (PDO) focuses on increasing the use of productivity and nutrition to enhance agricultural practices by smallholders in **Assuchnah** and **Bait Alfaqeeh** districts, Hudaidah governorate. This will be achieved through restoring and enhancing access to agriculture inputs, providing specific investments and technical assistance to improve agriculture yields and nutritional value and upgrade diversify agriculture and livestock production and marketing.

In the extension phase April -October 2019 activities in **Alzaydiah** district have been added to be supervised and items to be distributed by Ghadaq Organisation.

Under the LoA conditions signed between the FAO and GHADAQ the activities have targeted poor and food-insecure households as well as beneficiaries affected by the conflict. The following groups have been given priorities:

- (i) Landless farmers with no or few livestock;
- (ii) Sharecroppers and causal workers;
- (iii) Smallholder farmers with less than 1.3 ha of land;
- (iv) Women-headed households;
- (v) Conflict affected households, returnees and IDPs.

2. Purpose and deliverable outputs

The purpose of the activities is to restore and increase the use of productivity and nutrition enhancing agricultural practices by smallholders in targeted project areas of As- Sukhnah, Alzaydia and Bayt AL- Faqeeh districts. This will be realised through livelihood assistance in terms of training, awareness building and technical support by distribution of agricultural inputs like dairy equipment, live animals, animal feed, poultry and cereal and forage seeds.

About 11,176 Households most vulnerable and food insecure households in As -Sukhnah and Bayt AL- Faqeeh districts will make use of the current ongoing interventions.

a. OUTPUTS

- 1. Training and capacity development sessions to 100% of the targeted households (one training sessions for each beneficiary group) on topics related to restocking, dairy and crop production.
- 2. Distribution of livelihoods assets (sheep and goats) and inputs (forage and cereal seeds, animal feed concentrate, feed blocks, poultry, and dairy

equipment) to beneficiaries in the districts of **As- Sukhnah, Bayt- AL Faqeeh and Alzaydia** of Hodeidah governorate. FAO inputs are expected to be delivered in good safety and timely manner to poor households in a maximum period of 9 months from the entry into force of the Letter of Agreement (LOA).

b. OUTPUTS INDICATORS OF THE FIRST PHASE

- 160 households supported with livestock inputs.
- 238 households supported with poultry inputs.
- 400 households supported with forage seeds inputs
- 2,143 households supported with dairy equipment and 200 HHs supported with chopper forage machines.
- 8,035 HHs supported with cereal seeds (sorghum and millet)
- Number of training sessions conducted on the five areas of intervention (livestock, poultry, dairy and forage and cereal seeds) to 100% of the targeted households (based on the input each HH is receiving).
- Number of households aware of the complaints and feedback mechanism.
- Number of community committees established.

3. RESPONSIBILITIES


GHADAQ has taken the following actions under direct overall supervision of the Director of Agricultural Office in the governorate:-

- Prepare distribution plan in each location complete with names of the beneficiaries;
- Arrangements to contact all beneficiaries
- Coordinate with the suppliers to identify and fix the places in each district as distribution points for livestock, poultry, animal feed, dairy equipments and forgae and cearal seeds.
- In coordination with supplier, local authorities at district, Director of Agricultural Office in governorate carry out distribution of all inputs to the targeted beneficiaries.
- Prepare the distribution names lists containing the same agreed lists of beneficiaries and containing the following data: the name of beneficiary, the village name, Sub-district (Ozlah) name, District name, Quantity of inputs received, Stamp (Fingerprint) and the bottom of each list should include the signature and stamp of director of local authority, director of agricultural office in the districts and governorate.


4. TARGETED BENEFICIARIES

Map 1 and map 2 reflect the targeted districts, sub districts and villages. Table 1 shows the actual direct targeted sub districts. We have worked in 5 sub districts and 11 training and distribution points. The type of the training distribution points are mostly

schools. In Some cases, we have to select Al-Aqel houses as distribution points. The due figures of targeted sub districts and villages of As-Suchknah district are reflected in map 2 and table 1.


5. IMPLEMENTATION OF ACTIVITIES OF THE FIRST PHASE

a. SEQUENCE THE CONDUCTED ACTIVITIES:


- Letters from the FAO representative in Yemen addressed to governor of AlHudeidah and to the director of the National Authority for Coordination of Humanitarian Affairs in AlHudeidah have been delivered in Mach 2018;
- Starting the work immediately after receiving positive response to the above mentioned letters by contacting:
- The head of the Tehama Development Authority (TDA),
- The office of the governor of AlHudeidah;
- Receiving approval and letters from the governor of Hudaidah ordering responsible figures on the governorate and at districts levels to support and help "Ghadaq for Development" in its current activities. The letters of the gevernor were addressed to:
- The director of security in AlHudeidah governorate;
 - (a) The general director of Bayt Al-Faqeeh district;
 - (b) The general director of Alsukhuna district;
- Appointing a general technical supervisor and a general coordinator and training supervisor

- Selection and contract the district coordinators for Bayt Al-Faqeeh and for Alsukhuna with the following main tasks:
 - (a) Help by contacting of local authorities and explain to them the purpose of the ongoing activities
 - (b) Help by selection of the surveyors teams in both districts;
 - (c) Help by training the selected teams on how to deal with the questionnaires;
 - (d) Day by day follow up the field work and receiving the forms filled and coming from every member of the field team, archive the forms, entering the data in the due lists;
 - (e) Weakly report to the general coordinator and training supervisor.
- Selection of surveyors;
- Training the selected surveyors and giving them clear instructions on how to start the work, what of lists of beneficiaries every surveyors should take with him and to which villages he should go;
- Giving the surveyors contacts of the head of every village "A'qel" to contact and inform him about the purpose of the visit.

Map 3 and map 4 show the training and distribution points in the sub districts and the villages of the two districts. In Bait —Al-Faqeeh there were eleven training and distribution points spread in five sub districts. In As-Suchnah there were three training and distribution points in the two main sub districts.





7. CHALLENGES ENCOUNTERED THROUGH THE IMPLEMENTATION OF THE


- Time pressure and security and movements problems due to the ongoing escalation in Hudaidah;
- Training leaflets were very limited or came too late;
- Receiving only 4000 kg of forage seeds instead of 5000 kg; and therefore distributing 20 kg for each Beneficiary instead of 25 kg;
- Iron doors and windows are exotic for Tihamah villages;
- Some of the sheep and goats received were not according to the specification (sick and very old cases have been rejected),
- The sheep and goats received in Bait Alfaqeeh were only 68.75 % of the expected amount (275 out of 400 heads);
- Most females HHs sent family male members for training and receiving of items and not coming by themselves;
- Further distribution of Animal feed concentrate has been stopped due to infestation with storage pests;

8. **LESSONS LEARNED**

- For building egg laying chicken houses all the materials should be used from the Tihama environment (wood and mud materials). Iron materials are subject for rusts due to the highly rel. humidity;
- Animal feed concentrate delivered to Bait alfaqeeh and Assuchnah was heavy infested with storage pests; therefore the supplier has been asked by the FAO representative to take the amounts back to be fumigated or replaced.
- FAO representatives should check the items once more shortly before delivering (storage pest cases in animal feed concentrate and delivering of very old animals might be avoided)
